During the past twenty-two years Ski Gull has taught 23,000+ sixth graders from 15 area schools to ski in our Sixth Grade Learn to Ski Program. Ski Gull's services also include children and adults with adaptive skiing needs. Our focus is to provide equal accessibility to all users of Ski Gull.
